The RCNAF is a project of the Riverside County Department of Housing and Workforce Solutions



Direct Financial Support & Assistance Grants are specifically designed to address Riverside County 501 (c)(3) or 501 (c)(19) nonprofit organizations that experienced public health or negative economic impacts due to the pandemic. Grants provided under this category will assist impacted nonprofits recover from pandemic impacts and will help build nonprofit capacity. The anticipated grant level is \$50,000-\$150,000 per nonprofit, to be awarded to approximately 50-60 grantees total.

Programmatic Grants seek to financially support programming and services for disproportionately impacted communities including those communities with low Healthy Places Index (HPI) scores to advance the County's HPI goals and initiatives. The anticipated grant level is \$50,000-\$150,000 per nonprofit to be awarded to approximately 30-40 grantees.

Technical assistance (TA) will be provided to Riverside County nonprofits to gain specialized services or skills to operate more effectively, strengthen sustainability, build capacity by leveraging financial resources, and improve core operations. The expected outcomes of the TA will be to improve nonprofits' long-term financial stability and to help them prepare for future funding opportunities to advance countywide outcomes.

The Riverside County Nonprofit Assistance Fund was established to build on Riverside County's efforts to strengthen, expand, and support the local nonprofit sector which has played a critical role in the COVID-19 pandemic response.
