Mark Carnevale stated they now have a microchip scanner at Cathedral City's local fire department.

# 9. <u>RIVERSIDE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF ANIMAL SERVICES:</u>

## Kim Youngberg, Deputy Director of Operations:

Kim Youngberg introduced Erin Gettis, the new director of Riverside County Animal Services. Erin stated she is excited to be here and to connect with the commission members. She invites anyone over to take a tour of our shelters. Erin stated she is working on the departments 90-day report. The 90-day report will be added to our next agenda to share with the commission.

## John Welsh, Public Information Officer:

John Welsh stated there is a vaccine and free microchip clinic at the Coachella Valley Animal Campus today. This was made possible with grant funding and there will be a few more clinics during the month of May. John invited the commission members to join and follow our social media platforms.

## Jackie Schart, Animal Services Chief:

Jackie Schart stated that there is a line forming for the vaccine and free microchip clinic happening today at the Coachella Valley Animal Campus. She also stated they are reminding the public about the 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday coming up and to make sure to microchip and put a collar with a tag on your pet to get them home. During this time of year animal services puts logos on their animal control trucks stating fireworks are illegal in Riverside County to help through the 4<sup>th</sup> of July.

# 10. ANIMAL SAMARITANS (Tom Snyder, CEO):

Michelle Bergeron stated that Animal Samaritans received a donation for \$750,000 from the Richard Brook Foundation to assist with their new pet adoption center they are building. Their goal is to raise \$11 million dollars. They are also in the process of hiring an Oncologist to assist public needing assistance with their pets with cancer.

# 11. PALM SPRINGS ANIMAL SHELTER (Dan Rossi, Executive Director):

Dan Rossi stated they received a \$12,500 microchip grant for the city. This is a low-cost TNR program for the public. They also receive \$30,000 a year from the city of Palm Springs for TNR. Palm Springs is looking forward to doing great things.

# 12. FRIENDS OF PALM SPRINGS ANIMAL SHELTER (Tamara Hedges, President):

Tamara Hedges introduced Dan Rossi, the new Executive Director of the Palm Springs Animal Shelter. Dan Rossi stated he we all have the same challenges, and we are working hard to resolve them.

At our next meeting on August 4, 2022, the commission members will discuss having in person meetings or continue to telecommute.

Kimberly Muzik will be leaving the commission and the city of Indian Wells. Kimberly also stated that the City of Indian Wells has a microchip scanner now as well.
